THE STRATEGY OF CONSERVATION OF MAUSOLEUM OF QING SI HUANG IN THE PROCESS OF RAPIDLY URBANIZATION

Abstract

Qing Si Huang was the first emperor of China. His tomb that included the terra-cotta arms was constructed about 2100 years ago. It was one of important historical site in the list of world heritage in 1987.

Mausoleum of Qing Si Huang locates in a rich area in agriculture and rans over 56 square kilometer. Up to now, most of them undiscovered. Nobody knows the certain scale and pattern about it.

Because the process of rapidly urbanization of Xi'an, expanding of city challenge conservation of the mausoleum. In 1999, Chinese government establishes an archeological park over there. It was the first test in this way in China. After analyzing the comprehensive situation about the site, the paper will introduce the strategy of conservation planning of the archeological park from regional scale to urban scale.
